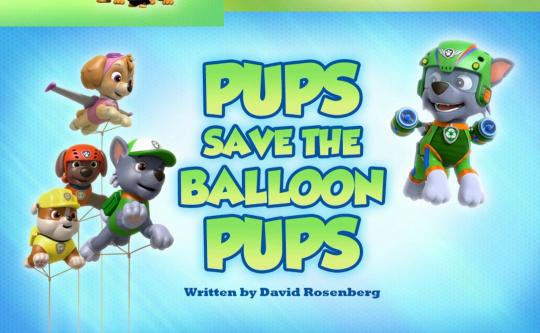














How do you define success?

"I would encourage you to seek out external collaborations as well to further enhance your impact."

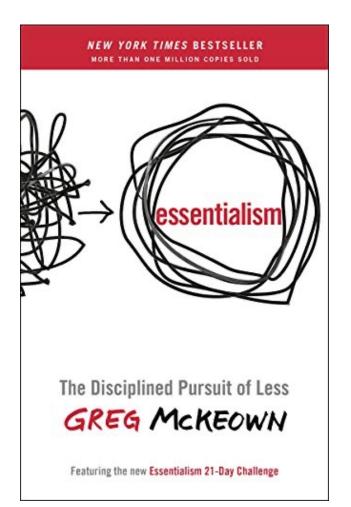

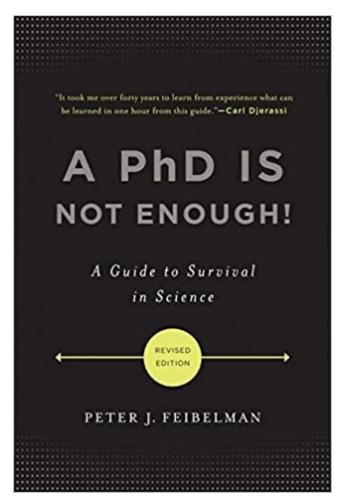


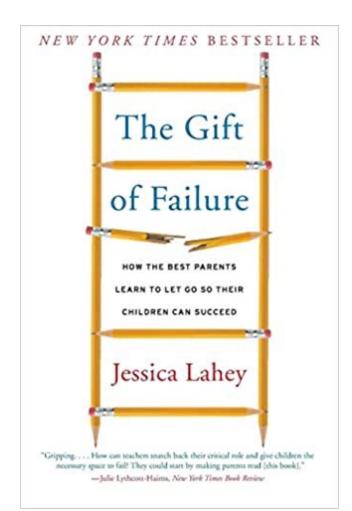
Random Thoughts
